What cookies does BAM place

BAM uses functional and analytical cookies on this website.

Functional cookies

Functional cookies ensure that the website works properly and, for example, your preferences are remembered.

Google Analytics

BAM uses Google Analytics so that Google can give us insight into how our website is used, to provide reports about the website to us, and to provide us with information about the effectiveness of our campaigns. The information is anonymised as well as possible, we cannot trace you personally. We have signed a processing agreement with Google, which establishes agreements on how to deal with the collected data. We have not given Google permission to use the information obtained for other Google services. However, Google may disclose information to third parties if required to do so by law, or to the extent that such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. Third-party Cookies

In addition to the functional and analytical cookies that BAM places, third party cookies are also placed. These so-called Third-Party cookies are present on a website when the website uses Plugins of third parties.

On this website, Third-Party Cookies are for example used for:

- The Social Share buttons; This allows you to share some content with others by clicking on an icon such as Twitter or Facebook.
- YouTube and Vimeo; These are the video players we use.

These Third-Party cookies are also read when another site is visited.
